This Temporary Regulation to Policy EBCF – Pandemic-Epidemic Emergencies - replaces previous Temporary Regulations adopted by the School Board

		Ending Isolation	
		You may end isolation <i>after</i> day 5 if: You are fever-free for 24 hours (without the use of fever-reducing medication) Your symptoms are improving	You may end isolation <i>after</i> day 5
		Masking	
		After you have ended isolation, wear a well fitting, good quality mask through day 10 or If you have access to antigen tests, with two sequential negative tests, taken 48 hours apart, you may remove your mask sooner than day 10 (proof of negative tests may be required)	

*[Symptoms of COVID 19](#): People with COVID-19 have had a wide range of symptoms reported – ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness. Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. Anyone can have mild to severe symptoms.

- I. Reporting
 - a. SAU19 will comply with any and all NH DHHS and DOE requirements for COVID reporting
- II. Testing
 - a. SAU19 will continue to make COVID-19 testing available to all students and staff as available
- III. Masking
 - a. Masks are still required for an individual from days 6 through day 10 if returning from having COVID-19. The CDC continues to recommend individuals wear a mask if they have been exposed to a positive COVID case for 10 days after last exposure and monitor for symptoms of COVID-19.
 - b. Per CDC guidelines, masks are recommended and may be required for students and staff accessing the nurses offices.
 - c. If guidance from public health officials changes, the Superintendent is authorized to adjust masking requirements accordingly the Superintendent will notify the School Board of any changes with respect to masking.
 - d. Masks or other mitigation measures may be required by the Superintendent if there is clear evidence of school-based uncontrolled transmission (COVID-19 spreading among individuals while in the school setting)
- IV. Identifying and Responding to Outbreaks
 - a. Although not required by NHDHHS, SAU19 will continue to monitor for potential COVID-19 Outbreaks
 - b. SAU19 efforts will focus on uncontrolled transmission and may respond with mitigation measures accordingly
 - c. The Superintendent is authorized to implement [mitigation measures](#) for cohorts or schools as needed to respond to uncontrolled transmission including but not limited to (masking, distancing, cohorting, cleaning/disinfecting, etc.)
 - i. The Superintendent will notify the School Board of any mitigation measures put in place
 - d. SAU19 may contact NHDHHS for additional support and guidance if uncontrolled transmission is suspected
